

## Colorado

The proposed \$1.05 billion reduction in Medicare Part A skilled nursing facility expenditures on a nationwide level has a substantial impact on the local, state, and national economies. The estimated economic impact for Colorado is a reduction of \$17,624,879 in business activity, a reduction of \$8,702,464 in labor income, and a loss of 251 jobs.

The following schedule illustrates the direct, indirect, and induced impact of this cut in reimbursement on the state of Colorado.

**Indirect Effect** represents the impact (e.g., change in employment) caused by the iteration of industries purchasing from industries resulting from direct final demand changes.

**Induced Effect** represents the impacts on all local industries caused by the expenditures of new household income generated by the direct and indirect effects of direct final demand changes.

**Total Impact** is the sum of the direct, indirect, and induced effects.

**Labor Income** is the sum of employee compensation and proprietary income.

# Colorado Congressional District 1

The proposed \$1.05 billion reduction in Medicare Part A skilled nursing facility expenditures on a nationwide level has a substantial impact on the local, state, and national economies. The estimated economic impact for Colorado Congressional District 1 is a reduction of \$1,553,917 in business activity, a reduction of \$818,579 in labor income, and a loss of 22 jobs.
