

South Carolina

The proposed \$1.05 billion reduction in Medicare Part A skilled nursing facility expenditures on a nationwide level has a substantial impact on the local, state, and national economies. The estimated economic impact for South Carolina is a reduction of \$21,481,309 in business activity, a reduction of \$10,568,920 in labor income, and a loss of 376 jobs.

Total Impact is the sum of the direct, indirect, and induced effects.

Labor Income is the sum of employee compensation and proprietary income.

The estimated economic impact for South Carolina Congressional District 1 is a reduction of \$3,533,639 in business activity, a reduction of \$1,821,270 in labor income, and a loss of 63 jobs.
