

Washington

The proposed \$1.05 billion reduction in Medicare Part A skilled nursing facility expenditures on a nationwide level has a substantial impact on the local, state, and national economies. The estimated economic impact for Washington is a reduction of \$30,040,458 in business activity, a reduction of \$15,196,492 in labor income, and a loss of 419 jobs.

The following schedule illustrates the direct, indirect, and induced impact of this cut in reimbursement on the state of Washington.

Induced Effect represents the impacts on all local industries caused by the expenditures of new household income generated by the direct and indirect effects of direct final demand changes.

Total Impact is the sum of the direct, indirect, and induced effects.

Labor Income is the sum of employee compensation and proprietary income.

Washington Congressional District 1

The proposed \$1.05 billion reduction in Medicare Part A skilled nursing facility expenditures on a nationwide level has a substantial impact on the local, state, and national economies. The estimated economic impact for Washington Congressional District 1 is a reduction of \$3,533,507 in business activity, a reduction of \$1,867,213 in labor income, and a loss of 48 jobs.
