

LONG-TERM CARE QUICK START GUIDE: PREPARING FOR RESPIRATORY VIRUS SEASON



When <u>respiratory viruses</u> are spreading in the community, the risk for spread in long-term care (LTC) settings including nursing homes increases as well. Existing infection prevention and control measures can help prevent and slow the spread of <u>flu</u>, <u>RSV</u>, and <u>COVID-19</u> to protect residents and staff. Preparing and responding to respiratory viruses in LTC settings requires a comprehensive approach that includes infection prevention, testing, vaccination, and treatment.

Infection Prevention and Testing

Implement recommended infection prevention and control practices in the facility. Be aware when respiratory virus levels are increasing in the community and ensure access to respiratory viral testing with rapid results.
